

MAKE A ROCK-WALLABY TAIL

FRIENDS OF THE BRUSH-TAILED ROCK-WALLABY

Brush-tailed rock-wallabies have a special long, furry tail that they use for balance as they hop around cliff faces. Follow the steps below to create your very own rock-wallaby tail.

MATERIALS

- Tape measure
- Long strip of cardboard
- Scissors
- Glue
- Materials to decorate (wool, paint, pom poms, glitter etc.)

STEPS

- 1. Measure your height using the tape measure and write this down
- 2. Tape/glue together enough cardboard or paper to make a long tail (or if you have one long piece then use that), the same length as your height
- 3. Draw an outline of a tail of this length, with the width starting at 8cm, then growing to 12cm wide at the end.
- 4. Cut this tail outline out.
- 5. Decorate this shape as desired, leaving a 10cm gap at the thinner end. You can try to cover it in wool, paint it with little dots, or come up with your own design!
- 6. When finished and any glue has dried, fold the 10cm tab over.
- 7. Tuck the tail into your pants and jump like a wallaby!
